A note about the service: Tonight we remember and celebrate the final supper Jesus shared with his disciples and the beginning of our sacrament, the Lord's Supper. We will also have a Tenebrae Service. The word Tenebrae is Latin for shadows or darkness. We remember the betrayal and abandonment Jesus experienced by extinguishing candles leading to near darkness in the sanctuary.


